## Remembrance Poppy...November

This is a traditional “Snowball” pattern repeated four times to create a Poppy.

This was introduced to me by Diane Stevenson and since then,

I have seen the block used for a multitude of flowers.

This is simple and a fun block to make...using beads in the centre for stamens would make it more interesting.

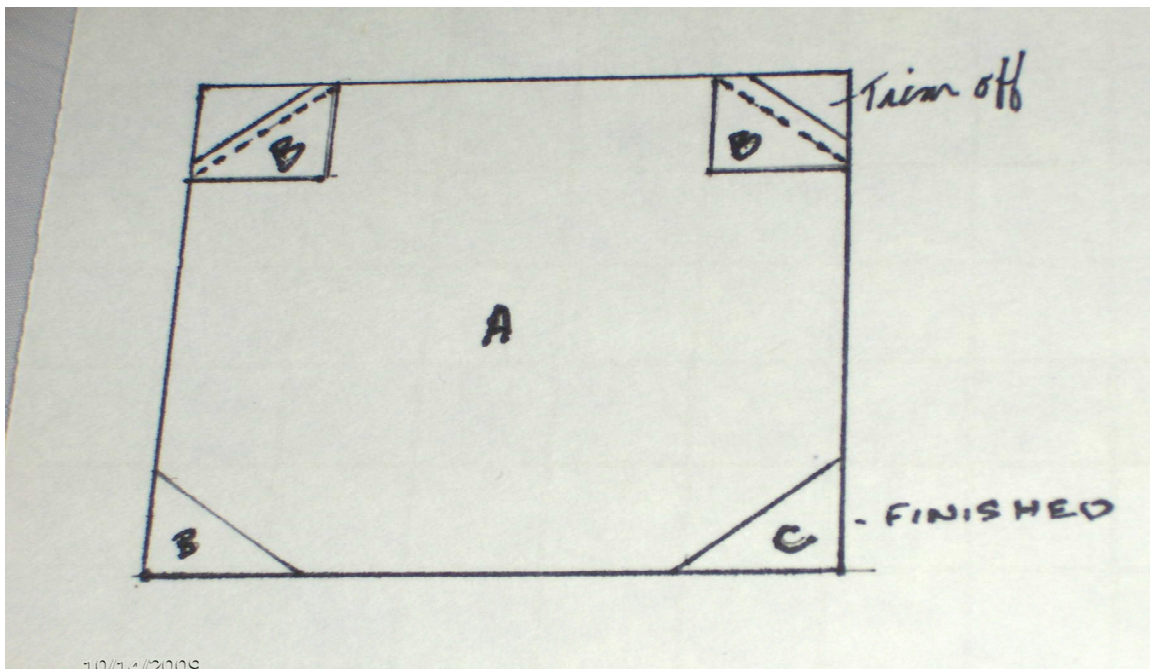
### Colours used:

Feature fabric: Red (a)

Background fabric: Neutral (b)

Poppy centre: Purple (c)

- a. **Red:** Cut 4 – 4 ½” squares
- b. **Neutral:** Cut 12 – 1 ½” squares
- c. **Purple:** Cut 4 – 1 ½” squares



Three corners will have the neutral background lined up with the red corners.  
Sew on the diagonal, trim, and press.

The purple will be used on one corner only; sew in the manner above.

When the four squares are assembled, place them so that the four purple corners meet in the centre.

Sew the top two blocks together, then the bottom two.

Then join the top and bottom rows.
