## 8 finished, $81 / 2 "$ unfinished

## Colours:

- 2 different black prints (for flying geese units)
- 1 black (or black on black print that reads like a solid) - for centre 4 patch unit
- 1 white solid (or white on white print that reads like a solid) - for centre 4 patch unit and for flying geese units
- 2 different green prints (similar value) - for centre section and for the top/bottom


Cut 1 black print rectangle $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 31 / 2 "$ from each black print fabric. We'll make a flying geese unit from each of these. Cut out 4-3 $1 / 2$ " squares of the white fabric and place 1 white square on the right side of each rectangle. Stitch from top left corner to bottom right corner. Cut away the extra triangles $1 / 4$ " away from seam and press towards right corner. Now repeat this for the left sides too (as shown) and press towards the left corner.


Put the 2 completed flying geese units aside for now.

Cut 2 white and 2 black squares $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{11 / 2 "}$ and create a 4 patch unit.


Cut 2 squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2 "$ from one of the green prints and sew to top and bottom of the 4 patch unit. Make sure the black is on the top left.


Attach a flying geese unit to left side and to right side of the centre unit that you have just created. The largest side of the black triangle in the flying geese unit should be on the outside of the block (as shown in picture).

Cut 2 rectangles from the second green print that are $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{1 / 2 "}$ ". Sew one of these rectangles to the top and bottom of the unit to complete the block.
