

**Fraser Valley Quilters' Guild  
June 2016 Block of the Month**

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Double Wrench – 7 ½ inch finished

**Fabric Requirements**

Bright Colour – your choice

Cut a 2" wide strip nine inches long (this allows an extra inch for trimming)

Cut 2 – 4" squares

White – background

Cut a 2 " wide strip nine inches long

Cut 2 – 4 " squares

Cut 1 – 2 inch square

Sew the two 9 inch strips together on the long side. Press to the coloured side. Cut 4 two inch segments.

On the two white 4" squares mark a line on the diagonal. Put each one right sides together with a coloured square and sew ¼ inch down each side of the drawn line. Cut on the line and press open the ½ square triangles you now have. Press to the dark side. Trim these four squares to 3 ½ inches square.

Take two of the 2 inch segments you cut and join them end to end, with white on the end, so they will be white, colour, white, colour, then sew the remaining white 2 inch square on the end so now your row has white on each end and in the middle. Set this aside.

Assemble

Top row will be a ½ square triangle (white on the corner) then a segment with white to the outside, then another ½ square triangle. Make another row repeating this. Now join the top row to the segment row you set aside. Now sew your bottom row to the other side of the segment row. Use the picture as a guide for the placement.
