

Block of the Month

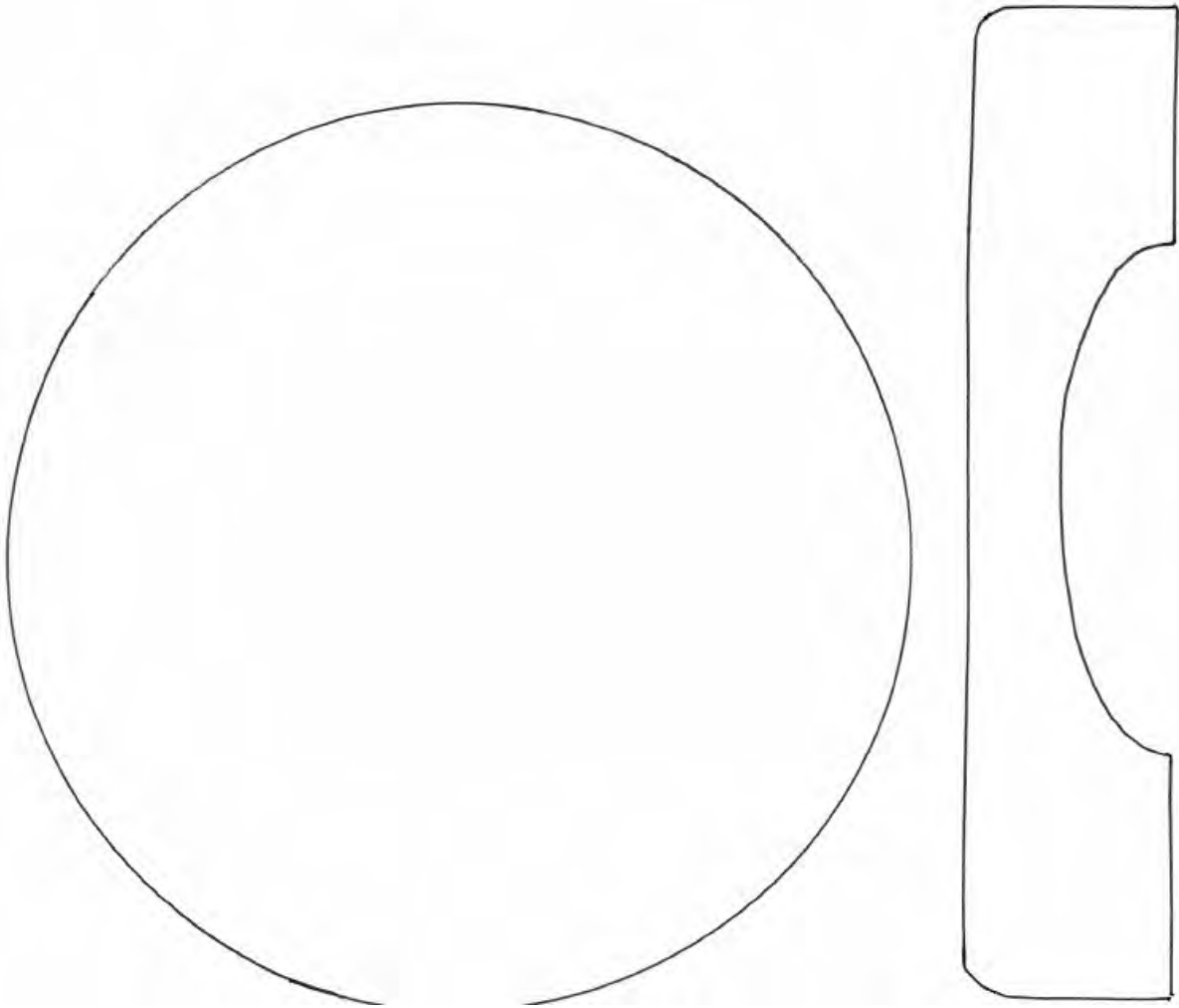


Christmas Globe. 8 ½ inches finished

Nine inch square of white for background
(trim to 8 ½ inches when finished appliqué)
Focal fabric for globe

Dark colour for the stand.

Use a product like steam a seam or heat and bond for attaching, and stabilizing the appliqué, and follow the instructions for use, that come with the product you choose. Once you have your appliqué prepared and ready to press on to the white background square, lay them on to get an idea of how they will look and how they will be centered before you actually press them down. When you're satisfied with the layout, start with the globe, putting it about 1- 1/8 inches from the top of the white background square and there should be a margin of about 1 ½ inches on each side. Press it on, then blanket stitch around. Put the stand on, overlapping the globe on the bottom. The bottom of the stand feet should be approximately 1- 1/8 inches from the edge of the white square. Then press and blanket stitch around the stand. Now trim the block to 8 ½ inches, trimming evenly on each side to keep the globe centered on the block.
