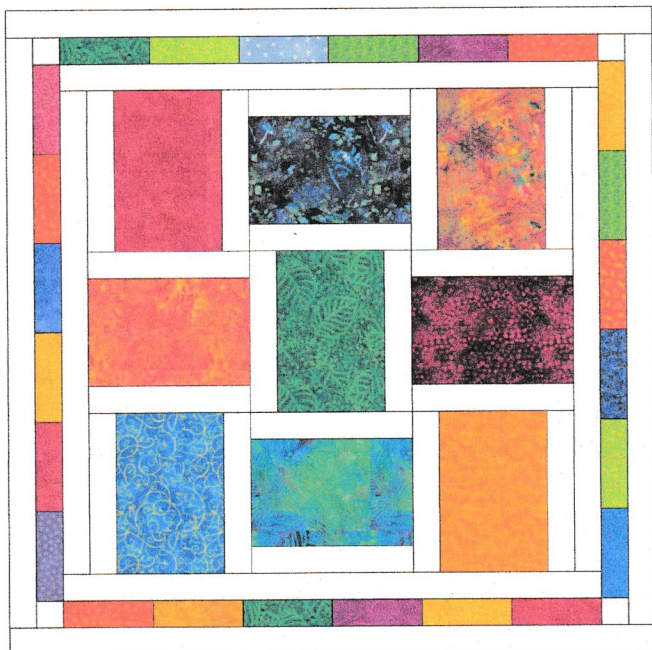


Floating Rectangles – Same quilt – light or dark background

36 " Square Premie Quilt



You will need approximately .7 of a metre of the neutral (black or white) or a little more to allow for a mis-cut (also known as an 'oopsie').

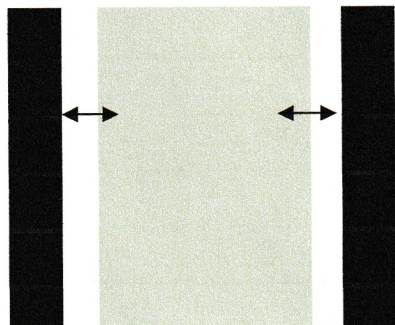
9 colourful scraps – large rectangles are $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$ plus smaller rectangles for the 2nd border are $5\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2''$ (24 total small rectangles for the quilt)

Cut

13 - 2" strips x width of neutral background fabric

sub-cut these into:

18 rectangles that are $2'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$ (each block needs 2 strips)



Sew 1 smaller strip to each side of the large rectangles. Make 9 blocks. Follow diagram, for placement in the quilt. Every 2nd block is turned 90 degrees. Sew 3 blocks into 1 row, make 3 rows.



BORDERS

Cut

1st Border (neutral fabric) – 2 strips $2'' \times 27\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew one to each side of quilt.

2 strips $2'' \times 30\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew one to top and one to bottom of quilt.

2nd Border – Sew 6 of your smaller coloured rectangles(end to end) to make a strip. Make 2 of these strips and then add one to each side of the quilt. Sew 6 more coloured rectangles (end to end) and add a 2" neutral square (white or black) to each end of the strip. Make 2 of these strips. Sew one to the top and one to the bottom of the quilt.

3rd Border – (neutral fabric) – 2 strips $2'' \times 33\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew one to each side of quilt.

2 strips $2'' \times 36\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew one to top and one to bottom of quilt.

Quilt as desired and add binding.
