

## Expanding Chevrons

Inspired by Spice Rack from Missouri Star Quilt tutorials. See their video for another construction method. Also similar to the Walkabout from Grizzly Gulch.

From your main print fabric you will need  
13 squares cut 6 1/2 inches and  
4 WOF strips cut 3 inches



From background and a secondary print you will need to make 12 each of flying geese blocks, one set with light back and the other with dark (or contrast) using method of your choice. These should measure 6 1/2 x 3 1/2 to finish 6x3 in your quilt.

If using 4 at a time flying geese you will need 3 sets of each....large square 7 1/4 inch and 4 small squares 3 7/8 for each set. (Of each fabric 3 - 7 1/4 inch squares and 12 - 3 7/8 inch squares.)



Sew one of each flying geese together to make the chevron.

Arrange the 25 blocks as shown and sew together.

Cut 4 - 1 inch WOF of a 4th fabric (or more of your secondary fabric) for a narrow inner border. Add the second border of your 3 inch print strips.

After quilting bind with the same fabric as used for the inner border.

Note: if you are wondering about my funky border...it's called "not enough print left!"
